Commentary

Top month-to-date contributors: Public Storage; Medtronic PLC; Altria Group Inc; Philip Morris International Inc; Ryanair Holdings PLC

In this space, we discuss one top contributor (Ryanair Holdings) and one bottom contributor (Cable One) from the recent month.

In August, shares of Ireland-based Ryanair, a low-cost airline focused on the European market, recovered from July weakness. In July, the stock was pressured by concerns about consumer weakness after Ryanair reported surprisingly poor fares in its June-ending quarter and cautious guidance for the all-important September-ending quarter, which typically generates most of the company's full-year earnings. The stock rose this month on comments by CEO Michael O'Leary that the summer has been better than feared, with fares likely down much less than previously expected. In addition, the company announced that it is stepping up its capital return program as strong traffic growth and aircraft delivery delays are boosting its cash balance. Over the last decade, the company retired 20% of its share count. This is remarkable considering it was a growth-focused airline and still had net cash after a pandemic. In addition to stock buybacks, Ryanair recently initiated its first dividend policy. The stock sells at an attractive low-double-digit P/E, but we do not need multiple expansion for this investment to contribute well to our portfolio income and capital appreciation objectives.

Shares of Cable One, a small cable company operating in rural US markets, have remained weak due to depressed broadband subscriber growth, driven by competition from wireless providers, fewer residential moves in a frozen US housing market and the end to the ACP (Affordable Connectivity Program). Further, increased promotions to stem subscriber losses have reduced average revenue per subscriber. Aiming to stabilize broadband revenue, Cable One has been making strategic adjustments designed to add customers without sacrificing pricing. A reorganization that removes layers of middle management is also underway, which should create costs savings and potentially provide operational benefits. Despite recent growth challenges, free cash flow conversion remains solid, supporting its dividend (currently yielding 3.4%), and the valuation is highly attractive, having a free cash flow yield of ~12% and selling below our estimate of 8X normalized earnings.

Free Cash Flow is a measure of financial performance calculated as operating cash flow minus capital expenditures. Price-to-Earnings (P/E) is a valuation ratio of a company's current share price compared to its per-share earnings. Normalized Earnings are earnings that are adjusted for the cyclical ups and downs over a business cycle. Free Cash Flow Yield is an overall return evaluation ratio of a stock, which standardizes the free cash flow per share a company is expected to earn against its market price per share. The ratio is calculated by taking the free cash flow per share divided by the share price. Dividend Yield is a financial ratio that shows how much a company pays out in dividends each year relative to its share price.

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
