Commentary

A mid-month rotation away from large-cap growth toward small-cap value shares resulted in muted global equity returns in July. A security software patch that crashed computer systems across the globe further challenged returns. Convinced of a September federal funds rate cut, investors pushed Treasury yields lower. Despite mixed economic data and lower market values, Japanese equities began to recover after the BOJ raised interest rates and laid out plans for quantitative tightening. The yen strengthened on the dollar.

The portfolio outperformed the MSCI EAFE and the MSCI AC World ex USA Indices. Both sector weighting and stock selection effects led to this result.

Our holdings in health care generated strong relative performance, particularly Argenx and UCB. Both biopharmaceutical companies have built pipelines of innovative new treatments for people with unmet severe and chronic diseases that are now coming to market and are finding success. Argenx rose this month on the performance VYVGART® Hytrulo, a first-of-its-kind injectable biologic treatment that is reshaping how adults with generalized myasthenia gravis (MG) and chronic inflammatory demyelinating polyneuropathy (CIDP) are treated. Medicine can be delivered safely in seconds versus over one hour for intravenous infusions. The company reported Q2 sales that were 12% higher than consensus estimates. The data show that Argenx's subcutaneous (short needle) delivery mechanism is expanding the revenue opportunity by taking share away from oral steroids, which have safety concerns. Also, UCB reported consensusbeating results driven by sales of its psoriasis treatment Bimzelx®, which continues to track ahead of analyst expectations in its US launch. The data show that a growing percentage of doctors are prescribing Bimzelx® to new patients as well as to those who have failed other psoriasis treatments. This is an encouraging indication of doctors' growing preference for the new brand. Earlier in the year, the European Commission approved Bimzelx® for patients with hidradenitis suppurativa (HS), an associated skin condition. We think the better-than-expected US rollout combined with the expanded HS market opportunity in Europe will increase Bimzelx[®]'s peak sales from €4.5 billion to €5 billion.

Alternatively, the portfolio's industrials holdings weighed on relative performance in the sector. Our two low-cost airline holdings, Ryanair and Wizz Air, detracted from returns. Ryanair fell sharply after it reported a 15% drop in its ticket prices in the recent quarter and a 46% year-overyear profit decline. The airline warned of further weakness as the summer travel season crests. Similarly, Hungary-based Wizz Air reported a 44% quarterly operating profit decline. The lowcost airline also experienced pricing pressure, something which is challenging the industry. In addition, with 46 of its planes grounded due to problems with Pratt & Whitney engines, Wizz Air continued to face capacity constraints.
